Travelling to Glasgow & public transport in Glasgow

There is not only Glasgow airport, but more options:

- 1) Edinburgh airport. The train takes only 45 minutes from Edinburgh to Glasgow and runs every 25 minutes. More info at:

- 2) There are several direct train connections to Glasgow from other UK cities, so you should also consider train and ferry connections. From London, trains take approximately 6 hours, from Newcastle (ferry to Amsterdam) trains take 2,5 hours. A nice way to see a piece of Scotland/England ...

Public transport in Glasgow:

The hotel (Jurys Inn) and the conference venue (Glasgow city chambers) are 5 minutes walk from the central railway station, and 30 minutes by bus from the Glasgow airport.

Jurys Inn is only 5 minutes from Central Station and 15 minutes from Queen Street Station with direct rail links to all parts of the UK, while the airports of Glasgow International and Glasgow Prestwick are all easily accessible.

From Glasgow Central station to Jurys Inn:

5 min walk: Exit Glasgow Central from Union Street exit. Turn right and keep walking down past MacDonalds. Jurys Inn Glasgow is situated at the end of this street.

From Glasgow Queen Street Station to Jurys Inn:

15 min walk: Take the George Square exit, Turn right on to St Vincent St, continue

forward and turn left on to Buchanan St, continue down to the end of Buchanan St, Turn right on to Argyle St, and take your immediate left at Woolworths on to Jamaica St, Jurys Inn is across the road on the right hand side.

From Glasgow International Airport:

There is a bus available at the airport which will take you to Central Station. The bus is available every 15 minutes and will take approx 20-30 minutes depending on traffic. Once at Central Station please see directions above.

From Glasgow Prestwick Airport:

There is a train service available at Prestwick airport which will take you to Central Station. These trains are available every half hour and will take approx 30-40 minutes. Please see directions above from Central Station to Jurys Inn Glasgow.

From Edinburgh railway stations

Edinburgh's main rail stations, Waverley and Haymarket, are in the city centre. Rail passengers can get between airport and station by taxi or by bus. The Airlink 100 service calls at Waverley and Haymarket stations. Journey times are 25 to 30 minutes in normal traffic. A night bus, the N22, also runs between Waverley station and the airport. The journey from both Waverley and Haymarket Stations to Queen Street Station Glasgow takes roughly 1 hour and trains run every 15 minutes upto 19:30 then run every 30 minutes.

From Edinburgh Airport:

Edinburgh International Airport is served by regular direct flights from many UK and European cities. Taxis between Edinburgh Airport and the Edinburgh city centre journey time is 20-30 minutes. A bus service to the city centre operates every 15 minutes until 1930 on weekdays and then every hour thereafter. The journey time is 45 minutes. At weekends buses leave every 30 minutes.
